- C** 13th Annual New Orleans International Music Colloquium, featuring academic presentations on the history of New Orleans music – Jazz National Park, Visitors Center, 916 N. Peters (see below)

10:00 – In the Cup: A Day Spent with the Mardi Gras Indians – Jon Pult relates Carnival Day 1989 spent roaming the streets with, and listening to, members of the Wild Magnolias

- 11:00 – Improvisation on Record – Dan Meyer will illustrate improvisation on early jazz recordings by comparing the music on alternate takes of the same piece
