Jack Stewart interviews members of the New Orleans Ragtime Orchestra, including Lionel Ferbos, Lars Edegan, and Orange Kellin, about serenading Satch. A portion of a film from the event will also be screened.

1:30 to 2:30 — John Brunious Tribute
On February 12, 2008, New Orleans lost long time Preservation Hall trumpeter John Brunious. Band mates and associates will talk about his work and influence. Moderated by seminar host and longtime friend, Mike Gourtier.

3:30 to 4:30 — Cinematic Satch: Louis Armstrong on Film with Ricky Riccardi
Following the clips from Newport in 1970, Riccardi continues with collector's items from Armstrong's last years, including performances from San Remo, Italy and an interview with David Frost.
